DISADVANTAGED WOMEN AND CHILDREN IN INDIA AND NEPAL

ACTIVITY REPORT 2023



Dear friends,

We are pleased to present you with an overview of CIAO KIDS Foundation's achievements in 2023. Thanks to your support, we have been able to effectively strengthen our impact across our three projects in India and Nepal. Efforts have focused on improving coordination with government systems and enhancing the quality of services provided to women and children.



The project in Nepal has made good progress - 6 schools (with a total of 1,500 pupils) are being actively supported. These schools have benefited from work to ensure a continuous supply of drinking water, which has had a major impact, particularly in terms of ensuring good hand hygiene.

The daily distribution of hot, nutritious meals at midday for 800 primary school pupils has proved to be a great incentive for children to attend school regularly.

All the savings groups are continuing their inter-member lending activities. In addition, the women have benefited from training and an initial grant in kind to start up vegetable farms and poultry and goat farms, thereby increasing their self-sufficiency.

The project for visually impaired children in India has received substantial support from the Lord Michelham Foundation, which has enabled a modern computer laboratory to be set up with software adapted to their specific needs. The grant has also encouraged the development of activities such as origami, drama, music and sport, contributing to the children's more holistic development. A programme of individual scholarships with personalised support has enabled 15 students who have completed their secondary education to go on to higher education in other cities.

The **fostership homes** have helped 70 young people to complete or continue their secondary and higher education. They have access to sewing machines and sport grounds, and take part in computer courses and workshops to improve their English skills.

Apprenticeships in computer and tailoring continue to be in high demand, and the centre run by our partner Amar Jyoti is recognised for the quality of its training. In 2023, 316 young people enrolled.

Awareness programmes are continuing in the villages, and the topics covered now go beyond social issues. They provide information on civic registration as well as on how to access the various government aid programmes that complement our services.



On 28 September, 200 people accepted our invitation to celebrate our 15th anniversary at the Casino de Morges. The evening included a spectacular performance by the mimic Yann Lambiel and an exclusive show by the artists' collective "De l'un à l'autre", featuring Simon Jaccard, Bastoun, Sandrine Viglino, Philippe Morax and Sophie de Quay.

The event generated a **net profit of over CHF 38,000** all of which will be allocated to our Nepalese projects.
